Conclusions

June's housing data are mostly negative – total starts are up down by 12.3% (m/m), single family homes starts are down by 9.1% (m/m), permits down by 2.2% (m/m), completions unchanged (m/m), and existing home sales were down by 0.6% from the month before.

Numerous negative macro-factors endangering a robust housing markets exist, in particular:

- 1) A constrained quantity of well-paying jobs being created;
- 2) a tepid economy;
- 3) little change in real median annual household incomes;
- 4) strict home loan lending standards – though loosening with new programs
- 5) slowing world economy brazing for trade wars; and
- 6) global uncertainty
